The Peyton Wright Memorial Fellowship

Peyton Wright was a graduate of the Department of Anthropology and a professional archaeologist. In his memory, his family and friends have established a fellowship program to aid other students in completing their graduate work in Archaeology. The Peyton Wright fellowship is a \$1000 award intended to allow archaeology graduate students to undertake a research project leading to the Masters or Ph.D. degrees. The purpose of this fellowship is to provide support for specific scholarly investigative projects. The fellowship is intended to cover costs associated with research projects.

Your application should include: (1) this application form; (2) a description of the proposed research (no more than two double-spaced typed pages); (3) a one-page resume including a description of any special qualifications of the applicant to conduct the proposed project; (4) a list of other present or pending support; and (5) an itemized budget. Preference will be given to applicants who have applied for research funds from outside of the University.

Successful applicants will be expected to submit a five-page report on their research at the completion of the field research.
