

Grants and Fellowships

University of Texas Awards

Faculty Research Assignment (FRA)

Amount: equivalent of one semester's salary based on the faculty member's nine-month academic base rate during the year the award is taken.

Eligibility: any tenured or tenure-track assistant, associate, or full professor who has completed at least four full academic years of service in residence at UT Austin.

Purpose: initiation, furtherance, or completion of a specific research project.

Deadline: September 5 (main office); reference letters due September 19.

Summer Research Assignment (SRA)

Amount: two months' salary based on the recipient's nine-month academic rate during the year of the award.

Eligibility: tenure-track assistant professors.

Purpose: provide faculty members with the equivalent of two months' salary while they concentrate on research and writing during the summer session.

Deadline: October 3 (main office); reference letters due October 10.

Special Research Grant (SRG)

Amount: up to \$750.

Eligibility: tenured and tenure-track faculty.

Purpose: to cover research-related expenses such as duplication, research assistants, travel to libraries.

Deadline: any time after September 1 and before May 31.

Faculty Travel Grants

Amount: up to \$1,200.

Eligibility: all tenured and tenure-track faculty (including emeritus faculty) or senior lecturers with at least five years service.

Purpose: to support tenured and tenure-track faculty in presenting their original research or creative effort at an appropriate organized conference or professional meeting.

Deadline: 2-3 weeks before convention/ travel date.

Big XII Faculty Fellowship Program

Amount: up to \$2,500 to defray expenses for the trip.

Eligibility: all tenured or tenure-track faculty, or those who have been in non-tenure-track faculty positions at UT Austin for at least six years.

Purpose: to stimulate scholarly initiatives among the universities that became affiliated through formation of the Big XII Athletic Conference. The program offers faculty the opportunity to travel to member institutions to exchange ideas and pursue research. Faculty visits will ordinarily be for about two weeks, but longer or shorter visits are possible

Deadline: April 28.

Research Grants

Amount: up to \$6,000.

Eligibility: Ph.D. holder; at least 5 years since awarded a research grant in the past.

Purpose: to provide funding for research assistants, research-oriented travel, research supplies and materials, and small items of research equipment.

Deadline: September 10.

Subvention Grants (from the University Co-op)

Amount: depends upon the amount needed for subvention.

Eligibility: faculty authors (including tenured and tenure-track faculty, senior lecturers and lecturers) and members of the research staff (Code 1000) are invited to submit their manuscripts. New faculty and assistant professors are strongly encouraged to participate.

Purpose: to assist University of Texas at Austin authors publish manuscripts requiring subventions.

Deadline: awards are ongoing until available funds are expended.

Long-term Externally Funded Awards (to be used anywhere)

American Association of University Women

Postdoctoral Research Leave Fellowship

Amount: \$30,000.

Eligibility: must have Ph.D.

Purpose: to support women scholars seeking funds for postdoctoral research leave from accredited institutions.

Deadline: November 15.

American Council of Learned Societies

Amount: \$60,000 for full Professor; \$40,000 for Associate Professor; \$30,000 for Assistant Professor.

Eligibility: a Ph.D. degree held for at least two years prior to the award application date.

Purpose: to help scholars devote six to twelve continuous months to full-time research and writing of a major piece of scholarly work, **not** including creative work (e.g., novels or films), textbooks, straightforward translation, or pedagogical projects.

Deadline: October 2.

American Philosophical Society Fellowships and Research Grants

Sabbatical Fellowships in the Humanities and Social Sciences

Amount: \$30,000 to \$40,000 for the second half of an awarded sabbatical year.

Eligibility: mid-career faculty of universities and 4-year colleges in the United States who have been granted a sabbatical/research year but for whom financial support from the home institution is available for only part of the year.

Purpose: to supplement an awarded sabbatical/research leave.

Deadline: October 15.

Guggenheim Foundation

Amount: amounts of the grants will be adjusted to the needs of the Fellows, considering their other resources and the purpose and scope of their plans (an average grant is \$43,200).

Eligibility: citizens and permanent residents of the United States and Canada.

Purpose: to further the development of scholars and artists by assisting them to engage in research in any field of knowledge and creation in any of the arts.

Deadline: September 15.

Amount: \$4,200 per month up to \$50,400 for 12 months.

Eligibility: faculty, staff, and independent scholars.

Purpose: for full-time, continuous research on a scholarly project.

Creative Writing

Amount: \$25,000.

Eligibility: please see eligibility terms here:

Purpose: to enable recipients to set aside time for writing, research, travel, and general career advancement.

Deadline: March 1.

Translation

Amount: \$10,000 or \$20,000

Eligibility: published a translation into English of a novel or a volume of 48 or more pages of fiction, poetry, or belles-lettres (creative nonfiction, criticism, and essays);
or

* published a total of 48 pages of translations of creative literature into English in literary magazines, anthologies, or books; or

* translated into English at least one full-length play that has been produced by a professional theater company.

Purpose: to support projects for the translation of specific works of prose, poetry, or drama from other languages into English.

Deadline: January 8.

Long-term Externally Funded Awards (to be used elsewhere)

American Antiquarian Society

Hench Post-Dissertation Fellowship

Amount: \$35,000.

Eligibility: scholars no more than three years beyond the doctorate whose work is relevant to the library's collections

Purpose: to provide the recipient with time and resources to revise the dissertation for publication.

Deadline: October 15.

The John Carter Brown Library Fellowships

Amount: \$4,000 per month (long term); \$1,800 per month (short term).

Eligibility: qualified scholars, engaged in productive research, for whom access to the collection is essential for the advancement of their work.

Purpose: to give scholars from this country and abroad an opportunity to pursue their work in proximity to a distinguished collection of primary sources.

Deadline: January 10.

Ahmanson-Getty Postdoctoral Fellowships

Amount: \$35,000 for the academic year.

Eligibility: scholars who have received a Ph. D in the last six years and are engaged in research pertaining to the announced theme.

Purpose: designed to encourage the participation of junior scholars

Deadline: February 1.

Mellon Research Fellowships (two)

Amount: \$50,000.

Eligibility: Ph.D.

Purpose: to support scholarly work that makes use of the collection.

Deadline: November 1.

Amount: \$40,000 (may be raised by the Folger to \$50,000).

Eligibility: Ph.D.

Purpose: to support scholarly work that makes use of the collection.

Amount: depends on country visited; award covers travel and some living expenses.

Purpose: Fulbright Scholar Programs offer U.S. faculty, administrators and professionals grants to lecture, do research, or participate in seminars around the world.

Deadline: August 1.

Houghton Library (Harvard University)

Amount: \$3,000 per month up to twelve months (maximum \$36,000).

Eligibility: pre- or postdoctoral.

Purpose: to enable scholars to make use of the library's holdings. Fellows are expected to be in residence for the duration of the fellowship.

Huntington Library Fellowships

Barbara Thom Postdoctoral Fellowships

Amount: \$45,000.

Eligibility: non-tenured faculty.

Purpose: fellowship is designed to support non-tenured faculty members who are revising a manuscript for publication and who are pursuing scholarship in a field appropriate to the Huntington's collections.

Deadline: December 15.

Mellon Fellowships

Amount: \$45,000.

Eligibility: Ph.D. or equivalent.

Purpose: applicants must be pursuing research in fields appropriate to the library's collections.

Deadline: December 15.

NEH Fellowships

Amount: \$50,000.

Eligibility: Ph.D. or equivalent.

Purpose: applicants must be pursuing research in fields appropriate to the library's collections.

Deadline: December 15.

Amount: \$40,000.

Eligibility: scholars in any area of Irish Studies.

Purpose: the NEH Keough Fellowship will enable an outstanding scholar to continue his or her research while in residence in the Keough-Naughton Institute during the academic year 2008-2009.

Amount: \$40,000 for six to twelve months.

Stanford Humanities Center

Stanford Humanities Program Fellowships

Amount: around \$52,000 per year for two years (plus moving expenses, etc.).

Eligibility: for recent recipients of the Ph.D. in relevant fields in the Humanities.

Purpose: to help recipients develop as scholars and teachers. Fellows will teach one course and the equivalent of a second each year as well as participating in the activities of the Program.

Deadline: December 3.

Stanford Humanities Center Fellowship from the Stanford Institute for Creativity and the Arts

Amount: up to \$60,000 and a housing and moving allowance of up to \$15,000 depending upon need.

Eligibility: for professional arts practitioners and critics and scholars. Must have relevant terminal degree, usually MFA or Ph.D.

Purpose: fellows must present their research at the Center and contribute to its intellectual life.

Deadline: October 15.

Virginia Foundation for the Humanities Resident Fellowships

Amount: \$15,000 per semester.

Eligibility: independent and affiliated scholars, professionals, and others working on projects in the humanities; applicants need not have advanced degrees.

Purpose: to provide time, space, and resources to scholars applying the tools of history, philosophy, ethics, cultural studies, and literary criticism to matters of public concern.

Deadline: October 15.

The Millicent C. McIntosh Fellowship for Recently Tenured Faculty

Amount: \$15,000, to which home institutions are expected to contribute another \$5,000 in addition to full salary and faculty benefits.

Eligibility: faculty holding associate professor rank tenured within the four years preceding the date of the award.

Purpose: intended for recently tenured faculty who would benefit from additional time and resources to continue their scholarly work, but whose family and other obligations make it difficult for them to be away from their homes for extended periods of time.

Amount: \$6,000.

Eligibility: Ph.D.

Purpose: to fund women faculty and independent scholars to prepare research for publication.

Franklin Research Grants

Amount: \$1,000-6,000.

Eligibility: Ph.D.

Purpose: to support the cost of research leading to publication in all areas of knowledge; to help meet the cost of travel to libraries and archives for research purposes; the purchase of microfilm, photocopies or equivalent research materials; the costs associated with fieldwork.
