Please join us for this two-day workshop examining the history of sexuality and slavery in the Americas. Although the history of sexuality for enslaved people of African descent has received limited attention in the historical literature, there is ample evidence in primary records to launch this field of study. The workshop seeks to address the methodological and archival issues that are true for any history of intimacy, and demonstrate how a history of sexuality for enslaved people can be constructed. We will discuss the politics of doing such a history, the research challenges, as well as the regional and transnational differences.
