DID YOU KNOW?

In 2007, UT Austin won **FIRST PLACE** in the national *Recyclemania* competition for Waste Minimization—beating 66 competitors by generating the lowest waste per capita!

Last year, we recycled close to 30 million pounds of paper—saving almost **25,000 trees** and over **4,800 cubic yards of landfill space!**

UT AUSTIN RECYCLES... AND SO CAN YOU!

Paper recycling at The University of Texas at Austin is managed by Facilities Services. Recycling paper is as easy as putting almost any paper product—including cardboard, newspaper, books—in a BLUE BIN instead of the trash.

DO recycle this paper:

- ◆ All white and colored paper, including coated, typing and photocopy
- ◆ Newspapers, including inserts
- ◆ Cardboard
- ◆ Envelopes, even with plastic windows or labels
- ◆ Folders—manila, coated, colored—even those with metal strips or plastic tabs
- ◆ Computer print outs
- ◆ Adding machine tape
- ◆ Direct mail, ads
- ◆ Brochures, pamphlets, posters
- ◆ Legal, steno and spiral note pads
- ◆ Scratch, message and memo pads, including self-adhesive notes
- ◆ Carbonless forms (NCR) and receipts
- ◆ Fax and telex sheets
- ◆ Books—hard- and soft-covered

DON'T recycle this paper:

- ◆ Carbon paper
- ◆ Lunch bags
- ◆ Paper plates and cups
- ◆ Napkins, paper towels and facial tissues
- ◆ Tissue paper
- ◆ Candy wrappers
- ◆ Waxed paper
