**IN MEMORIAM
GREGORY LAGRONE**

Gregory Lagrone, professor emeritus of Spanish and Portuguese, died on February 7, 1983. He was 70.

Professor Lagrone was born on November 5, 1912, in Winters, Texas. He received a bachelor's degree at East Texas State Teachers College in 1930. He earned a master's degree from The University of Texas at Austin in 1931. He was awarded a PhD degree from the University of Pennsylvania in 1936.

Dr. Lagrone taught at the University of Pennsylvania and the University of Wisconsin before joining the faculty of the University in 1946. He was a scholar of Spanish literature and language and published *The Imitation of "Don Quixote" in the Spanish Drama*. He also coauthored numerous language books, including *Español: Entender y Hablar*, a Spanish language and grammar textbook.
