**IN MEMORIAM
FILLMORE H. SANFORD**

Fillmore H. Sanford, professor of psychology, died on August 5, 1967. He was 53.

Professor Sanford was born on January 26, 1914, in Chatham, Virginia. He earned a bachelor's degree at the University of Richmond in 1935 and master's and doctoral degrees from Harvard University in 1937 and 1941, respectively.

Professor Sanford taught at the University of Maryland and at Haverford College. He joined the faculty of The University of Texas at Austin in 1957, where he was teaching at the time of his death.

Dr. Sanford authored *Psychology for Naval Leaders* (1949), *Authoritarianism and Leadership* (1950), and *Psychology: A Scientific Study of Man* (1961). He also published research in numerous journals, including the *Public Opinion Quarterly*, the *American Psychologist*, and the *Psychological Bulletin*. He served as editor of *Contemporary Psychology, A Journal of Book Reviews* in 1962.

Professor Sanford was a fellow with the American Psychological Association and served as president of the American Board of Examiners in Professional Psychology.
