**IN MEMORIAM  
LOIS TRICE**

Lois Trice, retired assistant professor of English, died on March 17, 1987. She was 91.

Professor Trice was born on September 20, 1895, in Dallas, Texas. She received bachelor's and master's degrees from The University of Texas at Austin in 1917 and 1929, respectively. She became a member of the faculty of the University in 1940 and taught in the Department of English until her retirement in 1966. She also taught Plan II courses in freshman English.

Professor Trice's contributions to UT Austin were recognized by a teaching excellence award from the Students' Association in 1958. In 1986 the UT System Board of Regents established the Lois Trice Endowed Scholarship in Plan II. In 1989, with a large gift from the Trice estate, the regents established the Trice Professorship in Plan II.

After her retirement, Professor Trice continued an active association with UT Austin, directing the Ruth Stephan Poetry Center for several years.
