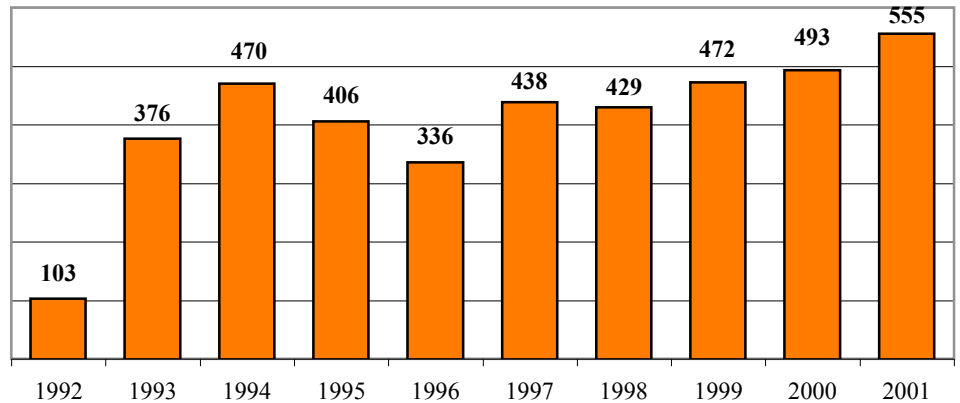

Ten Year Trend



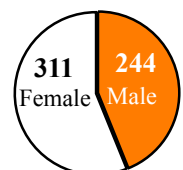
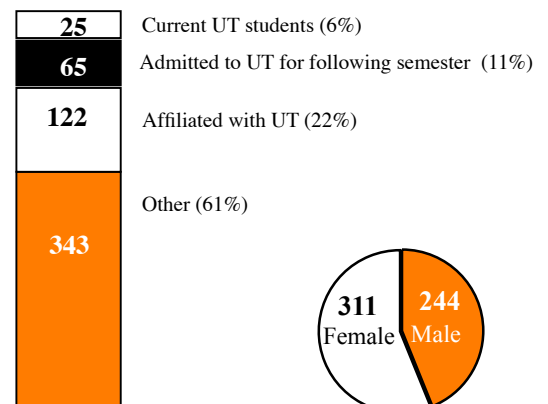
Program Description

ESL Services is a unit of the International Office. All ESL classes are held on the main UT campus. All faculty members have graduate degrees, speak at least one foreign language and have taught, traveled, or lived outside the U.S. Two programs have been designed to meet the needs of the ESL students.

Academic English Program (AEP) is designed for students planning to enter a Master's or Ph.D. program at the University of Texas or another U.S. university. AEP specifically prepares students for graduate study; classes meet five days for a total of 20 hours per week. Classes are limited to an average of 12 students.

English Language Program (ELP). The student body of ELP includes undergraduates, visiting scholars, businesspeople, and family members of UT faculty and students. Course content focuses on communication, study, business, or pleasure. The study plan ranges from intensive (20 hours a week) to part-time (5-15 hours a week) study.
