

POSTER PRESENTATIONS

Students working within the theme of the 2009 conference, “Human Rights at UT: A Dialogue at the Intersection of Academics and Advocacy” are invited to present their research through a variety of mediums, one of which includes a poster presentation. A poster presentation is a tool used to exhibit your hard work and research in a visually appealing manner. All poster presentations will occur simultaneously in a large room where viewers can circulate the room to study and discuss your research with you one-on-one. The poster should present your findings as well as an argument that supports the validity and importance of your research. Be sure to focus on the important details and central themes in your text, as your poster will not have room for a research paper. A few suggestions of things to include on the poster are a title, introduction, methods/results and conclusions. You may also include photos, figures and tables to help illustrate your findings. All text should be large enough to read from at least 5 feet away.
