Eligibility - minimum 29 credits. Transfer students not eligible.

Number of students - up to two per year.

Language - All courses taught in English.

Housing - Bucerius students going abroad can sublet their apartments to international students.

Courses - must take seven law classes. Students can also take a German course if they wish. Mandatory German Law Survey course counts as 2 credits.

Credits - 14 credits for the semester (pass/fail).

Exams - typically written and last 3-4 hours taken at the end of the course.
