Eligibility -minimum 29 credits at the time of application. Study abroad in 3L Fall semester. Transfer students not eligible.

Number of students –TWO semester seats available.

Language - Some courses taught in English (more in the fall than in the spring). Language evaluation can be found online.

Housing - Students apply for housing or live off-campus.

Courses – Students must take minimum of 24-30 ECTS credits. Credits transfer 24 ECTS: 12 U.S. Credits

Credits – Students must take 12-15 transferrable credits for the semester (pass/fail).

Exams – A December examination period is available for exchange students needing to return to the US by January.
