Eligibility - minimum 29 credits. Transfer students not eligible. 3.0 gpa.

Number of students - up to four per year.

Language - All courses taught in English.

Courses - must take four law classes (24 credits).

Credits – up to 14 credits for the semester (pass/fail).

Exams – June 11 – 27, October 29 – November 14
