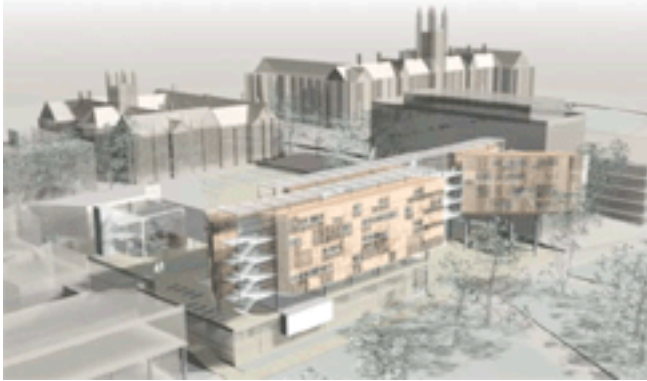

Location - City of Sydney

Eligibility - minimum 29 credits. Transfer students not eligible.

Number of students - up to four per year.

Language - All courses taught in English.

Housing - On-campus housing severely limited. The University will help students find suitable off-campus accommodation.

Courses - must take full course load (4 classes)

Credits - up to 14 credits for the semester (pass/fail)

Exams - June 17 - 28, November 11 - 22
Students are expected to be available for the entire exam period.
