<i>Postponed exams</i>	

Postponed exams must have the prior approval of Dean Ramos. Exams may only be postponed for medical reasons (verification needed) and family emergencies. Early exams are not permitted. To preserve anonymity, do not speak to your professor about postponing an exam. Call Dean Ramos' office at 232-1313.

If a student takes a postponed examination without permission of the assistant dean, the student will be dropped from the course and the symbol Q will be recorded. A student who fails to attend a final examination without the dean's consent may not take a postponed or special examination and will receive no credit for the course; the course will be counted as a course taken and failed when the minimum performance standards are applied and a grade of F (1.30 grade points) for the course will be recorded and will be used in calculating the student's grade point average.
