About the Program

For the past 56 years, The University of Texas College of Pharmacy has hosted an annual postgraduate pharmacy seminar for pharmacists. During this seminar, there is a New Drug Update lecture, which updates pharmacists on the new pharmaceuticals that have been recently released or are scheduled to be released in the near future. The audio recording of the lecture is accompanied by the lecture handout such that you can follow along at your own pace and at your convenience.

Program Goal and Objective

To provide pharmacists and technicians from all practice settings an opportunity to update their knowledge with the most recently released pharmaceuticals. After listening to the lecture and reviewing the accompanying materials, the practitioner should be able to:

- Describe the pharmacology, adverse effects, drug interactions, therapeutic uses and dosing of selected prescription drugs recently marketed.
