SPOUSES/GUESTS

The guest charge for lunch on Saturday is \$32 as part of the conference. **Other dining options are available in the hotel, or in and around San Marcos.**

Breakfast is free *for hotel guests.*

CHILDREN

There is no room charge for children 18 years of age or under if staying in the same room as the parent(s).

The Saturday lunch for children ages 5-12 is \$16. Children 13 years of age and older are charged the adult price of \$32.

Charges paid in advance are refundable up to one week before the conference; after that time they cannot be refunded. The Saturday late afternoon reception for preceptors and guests is compliments of the College.

A deposit of \$100 for preceptors is required to hold rooms and guarantee meals (\$50 if not reserving a room at the hotel). Please mail this deposit with your registration form. The deposit will be refunded upon your attendance at the conference or cancellation prior to the conference; therefore, ***if you are bringing guests, please send a separate check for their charges.*** If you do not come to the conference and have not notified the College one week prior to the conference, we will keep your deposit to partially cover the cost of the room and meals for which we are responsible.

**NOTE:** Check-in time is 3:00 p.m. If rooms are available prior to 3 p.m., the hotel may check you in ahead of schedule. However, please be aware that, more than likely, **you will not be able to check in earlier than 3 p.m.** Check-out time is 12 noon.
