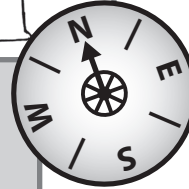
UT Austin held its first classes in 1883. The original campus was on 40 acres of land; it's much bigger now, but many people still call the center of campus "The 40 Acres."

The Tower is the tallest building on campus; it's 307 feet tall and was completed in 1937. The clock at the top of the Tower chimes every 15 minutes. If you count the number of peals that follow the chime at the top of each hour, you can tell what time it is (you'll hear one peal at 1 o'clock, two at 2 o'clock, and so on).

The open spaces around the Tower are called malls. A statue of Martin Luther King, Jr. is on the East Mall and statues of several people, including George Washington, are on the South Mall. A statue of Cesar Chavez was added to the West Mall in 2007. In 2009, the Barbara Jordan statue, the first statue of a lone woman at UT Austin, was added. She was a professor at the LBJ School of Public Affairs and served in the U.S. Congress for many years.

The Texas Memorial Museum, the exhibit hall of the Texas Natural Science Center, is located on campus at 2400 Trinity Street. The Blanton Museum of Art, the largest university art museum in the country, is located at MLK at Congress). The Bob Bullock Texas State History Museum (not a UT facility) is located across from campus at the corner of N. Congress and MLK.

Water, soft drinks, snacks and fast food are available in the Texas Union (#5 on the Scavenger Hunt). The University Co-op (a good spot for purchasing UT souvenirs and memorabilia) is located on Guadalupe Street west of the campus. The main pedestrian crosswalk is near the fountain at the end of the West Mall near the front of the Union.

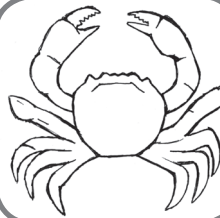
