2011-2012 Transfer Guide for Austin Community College Students

Degree Programs Available

Bachelor of Business Administration with majors in:

- Engineering Route to BBA
- Finance
- International Business

Additionally, the **Business Foundations Program** offers nonmajor business courses that can be used to supplement any degree plan outside the McCombs School (see <http://www.mccombs.utexas.edu/udean/major/foundations/>).

Prospective business transfer students are urged to become familiar with the School's curricula and rules in the *Undergraduate Catalog 2010-2012*, available at <http://registrar.utexas.edu/catalogs/>.

Students who transfer directly from a Texas community college are eligible to graduate under UT Austin catalog rules in effect during the time they attend the community college; those declaring the 2010-2012 catalog must complete all degree requirements by the end of the summer session 2018. At least sixty semester credit hours must be completed at UT Austin to earn an undergraduate degree.

Prospective students can monitor their UT degree progress – even before transfer – and check degree applicability of Austin Community College courses by using the “Planner” function of UT’s Interactive Degree Audit (IDA) system at <http://registrar.utexas.edu/students/degrees/ida/>.

Use of Transfer Credit Toward Degrees

The Office of Admissions evaluates courses from other institutions for comparability with UT Austin coursework, but the Dean's Office in the McCombs School approves transfer credit for use in a degree program.

High School Foreign Language Preparation

UT Austin requires all students to have completed two years of high school study in a single foreign language. Transfer students who do not meet this requirement are assessed a **foreign language deficiency**; removal of deficiencies is required for graduation. To remove a deficiency, credit for the second college-level course in a language (numbered 1512) is required. Credit used to remove a deficiency cannot count toward other degree requirements. Prospective students should complete coursework needed to satisfy a foreign language deficiency prior to transfer.

Special Notes

- Due to limited space in the McCombs School, **admission is highly competitive**; acceptance depends upon available space and the applicant's qualifications compared to the entire applicant pool. Transfer students are admitted **only in fall semesters**; applications are not considered for spring and summer terms.
- To be considered for transfer admission in Business, **applicants must have credit for MATH 2413+2414 (or 1425+1476) and ECON 2301+2302**.
- **Core curriculum** transfer credit from Austin Community College is guaranteed to apply toward UT core requirements, but degree plans may specify how to fulfill some core requirements. Recommendations in this Guide satisfy core requirements with courses normally prescribed by a student's major field of study at UT.
- Courses in which **grades lower than C-** are earned do not transfer. Grades from transfer credit are excluded from a student's internal **UT Austin grade point average** computation.
- **Physical education** activity courses do not count toward degree requirements in the McCombs School, but grades and credit count toward transfer admission.
- Up to twelve semester hours in **Air Force or Military Science** may count as elective credit toward degrees in the McCombs School by students commissioned through the UT Austin ROTC program.

Courses Recommended for Transfer

expressed in Austin Community College designations

Writing & Literature

ENGL 1301;
one Writing Flag course chosen from ENGL 1302 or 2311; and
one literature survey course chosen from ENGL 2322, 2323, 2327, 2328, 2332, 2333, or 2342.

Foreign Language

For the International Business major: four semesters in a single language, chosen from courses numbered 1511, 1512, 2311, & 2312. (*Students should select a language associated with the world region in which they plan to specialize.*)
For all other majors: in a single foreign language, either two years of prior high school credit or two college-level semesters chosen from courses numbered 1511 & 1512.

U.S. & Texas Government

GOVT 2305+2306.
(*Because A.C.C. and UT Austin organize the two-course legislative requirement sequence differently, it is strongly recommended that students take both courses at one institution.*)

U.S. History

Two courses chosen from HIST/HIS 1301, 1302, 1643, 2301, 2327, 2328, 2341, and 2381.

Social & Behavioral Science

ECON 2301+2302, required for admission to Business; and
one additional course chosen from ANTH 2351, PSYC 2301, or SOCI 1301.

Mathematics

For the Engineering Route to BBA major:
MATH 2413+2414+2415.
For all other majors:
a two-course calculus sequence, required for admission to Business, chosen from MATH 2413+2414 (preferred) or MATH 1425+1476. *MATH 1425 does not prepare students for Calculus II courses at UT Austin, so it is only recommended in combination with 1476. Students who transfer only 1425 are ineligible for Business admission and must complete an appropriate second-semester course to pursue internal transfer to Business; typical solutions are to take M 403L through University Extension or MATH 1476 at Austin Community College.*

Science & Technology

For the Engineering Route to BBA major:
CHEM 1311 and PHYS 2425+2426.
For all other majors:

- Part I – a two-course sequence in one discipline, chosen from
ASTR 1303+1304, 1403+1404, 1303+1404, or 1403+1304;
BIOL 1406+1407 or 1408+1409;
CHEM 1311+1312;
GEOL 1403+1404; or
PHYS 1401+1402, 1405+1407, or 2425+2426.
- Part II – a third course in a second discipline, chosen from those above and from
ANTH 2301 or 2302;
BIOL 1309, 1424, or 2306;
GEOG 1301; or
GEOL 1301, 1345, or 1445.

Visual & Performing Arts

One course chosen from ARTS 1301, 1303, or 1304; COMM 1307 or 1335; DRAM 1310 or 2367; HUMA 1315; or MUSI/MUS 1301, 1306, or 1773.

Other Coursework

BCIS 1305;
BUSG 2371; and
SPCH 1321 (preferred) or 1315.
