2011-2012 Transfer Guide for Austin Community College Students

Degree Programs Available

- **Bachelor of Science in Applied Learning & Development** with majors in
 - All-Level Generic Special Education (*leading to teacher certification*)
 - Early Childhood through Grade 6 Generalist (*leading to teacher certification, including a bilingual certification option*)
 - Youth & Community Studies
- **Bachelor of Science in Athletic Training**
- **Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology & Health** with majors in
 - Applied Movement Science (*leading to teacher certification*)
 - Exercise Science

Prospective Education transfer students are urged to become familiar with the College's curricula and rules in the *Undergraduate Catalog 2010-2012*, available at <http://registrar.utexas.edu/catalogs/>.

Students who transfer directly from a Texas community college are eligible to graduate under UT Austin catalog rules in effect during the time they attend the community college; those declaring the 2010-2012 catalog must complete all degree requirements by the end of the summer session 2018. At least sixty semester credit hours must be completed at UT Austin to earn an undergraduate degree.

Prospective students can monitor their UT degree progress – even before transfer – and check degree applicability of Austin Community College courses by using the “Planner” function of UT's Interactive Degree Audit (IDA) system at <http://registrar.utexas.edu/students/degrees/ida/>.

Use of Transfer Credit Toward Degrees

The Office of Admissions evaluates courses from other institutions for comparability with UT Austin coursework, but the Dean's Office in the College of Education approves transfer credit for use in a degree program.

High School Foreign Language Preparation

UT Austin requires all students to have completed two years of high school study in a single foreign language. Transfer students who do not meet this requirement are assessed a **foreign language deficiency**; removal of deficiencies is required for graduation. To remove a deficiency, credit for the second college-level course in a language (numbered 1512) is required. Credit used to remove a deficiency cannot count toward other degree requirements. Prospective students should complete coursework needed to satisfy a foreign language deficiency prior to transfer.

Special Notes

- Students pursuing middle grades, secondary, or all-level **teacher certification** in Texas must earn a bachelor's degree in the subject they intend to teach.
- **Core curriculum** transfer credit from Austin Community College is guaranteed to apply toward UT core requirements, but degree plans may specify how to fulfill some core requirements. Recommendations in this Guide satisfy core requirements with courses normally prescribed by a student's major field of study at UT.
- Courses in which **grades lower than C-** are earned do not transfer. Grades from transfer credit are excluded from a student's internal **UT Austin grade point average** computation.
- Up to three semester hours in **physical education** activity coursework may count as elective credit toward any degree in the College of Education.
- Up to nine semester hours in **Air Force or Military Science** may count as free elective credit toward any degree in the College of Education.

Courses Recommended for Transfer

expressed in Austin Community College designations

Writing & Literature

ENGL 1301;
one Writing Flag course ENGL 1302; and
one American, British, or world literature survey course chosen from ENGL 2322, 2323, 2327, 2328, 2332, 2333, or 2342.

Foreign Language

For all degrees and majors: two semesters in a single language, chosen from courses numbered 1511 & 1512; SGNL 1401 & 1402 can also be counted. (*Spanish is preferred for Texas teacher certification candidates.*)
For Applied Learning & Development-EC-6 bilingual certification candidates: four semesters in Spanish – SPAN 1511, 1512, 2311, & 2312.

U.S. & Texas Government

GOVT 2305+2306.
(*Because A.C.C. and UT Austin organize the two-course legislative requirement sequence differently, it is strongly recommended that students take both courses at one institution.*)

U.S. History

Two courses chosen from HIST/HIS 1301, 1302, 1643, 2301, 2327, 2328, 2341, and 2381.

Social & Behavioral Science

For Applied Learning & Development, all majors: PSYC 2301. *Additionally, for the Youth & Community Studies major:* one course chosen from ANTH 2351, ECON 2301 or 2302, GEOG 1303, or SOCI 1301.
For Athletic Training: PSYC 2301 and one course chosen from ANTH 2351, ECON 2301 or 2302, GEOG 1303, or SOCI 1301.
For Kinesiology & Health-Sport Management major: PSYC 2301 and either ECON 2301 or 2302.
For Kinesiology & Health, other majors: PSYC 2301 and one course chosen from ANTH 2351, ECON 2301 or 2302, GEOG 1303, or SOCI 1301.

Mathematics

For Applied Learning & Development-Youth & Community Studies major: one course chosen from MATH 1324, 1332, 1342, 1425, 2412, or 2413.
For Applied Learning & Development, other majors: MATH 1350+1351; and MATH 1324, 1332, 1342, or 2412 (MATH 1314 may also count, but only when transferred in combination with MATH 1350).
For Athletic Training or Kinesiology & Health-Applied Movement Science major: MATH 2412 or 2413.
For Kinesiology & Health-Exercise Science major: MATH 2413.
For Kinesiology & Health, other majors: one course chosen from MATH 1324, 1332, 1342, 1425, 2412, or 2413.

Science & Technology

For Applied Learning & Development-EC-6 Generalist or All-Level Generic Special Education major: a three-course integrated science sequence (NSC 306J+306K+306L), not available by transfer, fulfills both major and core curriculum requirements. Prospective students are encouraged to defer science coursework until enrolled at UT Austin; core curriculum transfer credit in natural science counts toward UT core requirements, but does not substitute for this sequence in the major.
For Athletic Training or Kinesiology & Health-Applied Movement Science or Health Promotion major: BIOL 1406 (preferred for pre-physical therapy/pre-medical students) or 1408; and CHEM 1311+1312.
For Kinesiology & Health-Exercise Science major: BIOL 1406, CHEM 1311+1312, and PHYS 1401+1402.
For Applied Learning & Development-Youth & Community Studies major or Kinesiology & Health-Physical Culture & Sports or Sport Management major:

- Part I – a two-course sequence in one discipline, chosen from ASTR 1303+1304, 1403+1404, 1303+1404, or 1403+1304; BIOL 1406+1407 or 1408+1409; CHEM 1311+1312; GEOL 1403+1404; or PHYS 1401+1402, 1405+1407, or 2425+2426.
- Part II – a third course in a second discipline, chosen from those above and from ANTH 2301 or 2302; BIOL 1309, 1424, or 2306; GEOG 1301; or GEOL 1301, 1345, or 1445.

Visual & Performing Arts

One course chosen from ARTS 1301*, 1303, or 1304; COMM 1307 or 1335; DRAM 1310* or 2367; HUMA 1315; or MUSI/MUS 1301, 1306*, or 1773 (**preferred for teacher certification candidates*).

Other Coursework

For Applied Learning & Development-EC-6 Generalist major: KINE 1331.
For Applied Learning & Development-All-Level Generic Special Education major or Kinesiology & Health-Applied Movement Science major: one course chosen from PSYC 2308 or TECA 1354.
For Athletic Training: BIOL 1323, KINE 2356, & SPCH 1321.
For Kinesiology & Health-Physical Culture & Sports or Sport Management major: BCIS 1305.
