Prospective Liberal Arts transfer students are urged to become familiar with the College's curricula and rules in the *Undergraduate Catalog 2010-2012*, available at <http://registrar.utexas.edu/catalogs/>.

Students who transfer directly from a Texas community college are eligible to graduate under UT Austin catalog rules in effect during the time they attend the community college; those declaring the 2010-2012 catalog must complete all degree requirements by the end of the summer session 2018. At least sixty semester credit hours must be completed at UT Austin to earn an undergraduate degree.

Prospective students can monitor their UT degree progress – even before transfer – and check degree applicability of Austin Community College courses by using the “Planner” function of UT’s Interactive Degree Audit (IDA) system at <http://registrar.utexas.edu/students/degrees/ida/>.

### Use of Transfer Credit Toward Degrees

The Office of Admissions evaluates courses from other institutions for comparability with UT Austin coursework, but the Dean's Office in the College of Liberal Arts approves transfer credit for use in a degree program.

### Special Notes

- **Core curriculum** transfer credit from Austin Community College is guaranteed to apply toward UT core requirements, but degree plans may specify how to fulfill some core requirements. Recommendations in this Guide satisfy core requirements with courses normally prescribed by a student's major field of study at UT.
- Courses in which **grades lower than C-** are earned do not transfer. Grades from transfer credit are excluded from a student's internal **UT Austin grade point average** computation.
- **College Algebra** (MATH 1314) counts as elective credit but does not satisfy the mathematics requirement in the College of Liberal Arts.
- **Physical education** activity courses do not count toward degree requirements in the College of Liberal Arts, but grades and credit count toward transfer admission.

# Courses Recommended for Transfer

*expressed in Austin Community College designations. Courses used to fulfill area requirements below may not be taken on a pass/fail basis.*

## Writing & Literature

ENGL 1301;  
one Writing Flag course chosen from ENGL 1302 or 2311; and  
one American, British, or world literature survey course chosen from ENGL 2322, 2323, 2327, 2328, 2332, 2333, or 2342.

## Foreign Language

*For the BS in Psychology:* two semesters in a single language, chosen from courses numbered 1511 & 1512.  
*For all other degrees:* four semesters in a single language, chosen from courses numbered 1511, 1512, 2311, & 2312.  
Foreign language majors should choose coursework in their field of study.  
SGNL 1401, 1402, 2301, & 2302 can be counted in the requirements above.

## U.S. & Texas Government

GOVT 2305+2306.  
*(Because A.C.C. and UT Austin organize the two-course legislative requirement sequence differently, it is strongly recommended that students take both courses at one institution.)*

## U.S. History

Two courses chosen from HIST/HIS 1301, 1302, 1643, 2301, 2327, 2328, 2341, and 2381.

## Social & Behavioral Science

One course chosen from ANTH 2351; ECON 2301 or 2302; GEOG 1303; PSYC 2301; or SOCI 1301 or 1306.

- Social science majors should choose beginning coursework in their field of study: anthropology–ANTH 2351; economics–ECON 2301+2302 (*both* required in the major); geography–GEOG 1303; psychology–PSYC 2301 with a grade of at least C; sociology–SOCI 1301 with a grade of at least C.
- ECON 2302 is required for the BS in Environmental Science.
- PSYC 2301 is preferred for teacher certification candidates.

## Mathematics

*For the BS in Environmental Science:* MATH 2413+2414.  
*For the BS in Psychology:* MATH 1342 & 2413.  
*For the BA with a major in Economics:* MATH 2413+2414. (MATH 1425+1476 cannot be counted.)  
*For the BA with a major in Sociology:* MATH 1342 with a grade of at least C.  
*For the BA with a major in Urban Studies:* MATH 1342 & 2413. (MATH 1425 or 1476 cannot be counted.)  
*For the BA degree, all other majors:* one course chosen from MATH 1324, 1332, 1342, 1425, 2412, or 2413. (MATH 1314, 1350, or 1351 cannot be counted.)

## Science & Technology

*For the BS in Environmental Science:* BIOL 1406+1407, CHEM 1311+1312+1111+1112, GEOG 1301, GEOL 1403, and PHYS 2425.  
*For the BS in Psychology:* two sequences in different disciplines, chosen from BIOL 1406+1407; CHEM 1311+1312+1111+1112; and PHYS 1401+1402 or 2425+2426.  
*For the BA degree (all majors):*

- Part I – a two-course sequence in one discipline, chosen from ASTR 1303+1304, 1403+1404, 1303+1404, or 1403+1304; BIOL 1406+1407 or 1408+1409; CHEM 1311+1312; GEOL 1403+1404; or PHYS 1401+1402, 1405+1407, or 2425+2426.
- Part II – a third course in a second discipline, chosen from those above and from ANTH 2301 or 2302; BIOL 1309, 1424, or 2306; GEOG 1301; or GEOL 1301, 1345, or 1445.
- No more than 9 semester hours in any single natural science discipline can be counted toward the BA degree.

## Visual & Performing Arts

One course chosen from ARTS 1301, 1303, or 1304; COMM 1307 or 1335; DRAM 1310 or 2336; HUMA 1315; or MUSI 1301, 1306, or MUS 1773.

## Bachelor of Arts Major Requirements

Fields of study available in the Bachelor of Arts are too numerous, and their requirements too varied, for this Guide to recommend beginning courses in each major, except as noted above. Prospective transfer students and their A.C.C. academic advisors are encouraged to download degree plans for specific majors from the College of Liberal Arts Web site at <http://www.utexas.edu/cola/student-affairs/Academic-Planning/Majors-and-Degrees/Degree-Plans.php>. UT Austin's ATE System, at <http://www.utexas.edu/student/admissions/ate/>, can then be used to identify equivalent A.C.C. coursework. Lower-division courses in the major often have no A.C.C. equivalent. In such cases, students should follow this Guide's recommendations for other prescribed courses and defer major coursework until enrolled at UT Austin.
