Prospective Education transfer students are urged to become familiar with the College's curricula and rules in the *Undergraduate Catalog 2008-2010*, available at <http://registrar.utexas.edu/catalogs/>.

Students who transfer directly from a Texas community college may choose to graduate under UT Austin catalog rules in effect during the time they attended the community college; those declaring the 2008-2010 catalog must complete all degree requirements by the end of the summer session 2016. At least sixty semester credit hours must be completed at UT Austin to earn an undergraduate degree.

Prospective students can monitor their UT degree progress – even before transfer – and check degree applicability of Texas community college courses by using the “Planner” function of UT’s Interactive Degree Audit (IDA) system at <http://registrar.utexas.edu/students/degrees/ida/>.

### Texas Common Course Numbering System

Course recommendations in this Guide are expressed in **Texas Common Course Numbering (TCCN)** designations, a uniform system of four-character abbreviations for academic disciplines and four-digit course numbers used by community colleges statewide. The first digit of the number denotes a course's academic level (0 = freshman, 1 = freshman, 2 = sophomore) and the second digit denotes semester hour credit value.

### Use of Transfer Credit Toward Degrees

The Office of Admissions evaluates courses from other institutions for comparability with UT Austin coursework, but the Dean's Office in the College of Education approves transfer credit for use in a degree program.

### High School Foreign Language Preparation

The University requires all students to have completed two years of high school study in a single foreign language. Transfer students who do not meet this requirement are assessed a **foreign language deficiency**; removal of deficiencies is required for graduation. To remove a deficiency, credit for the second college-level course in a language (numbered 1312, 1412, or 1512) is required. Credit used to remove a deficiency cannot be applied toward other degree requirements. Prospective students should complete coursework needed to satisfy a foreign language deficiency prior to transfer.

### Special Notes

- Students pursuing middle grades, secondary, or all-level **teacher certification** in Texas must earn a bachelor's degree in the subject they intend to teach.
- **Core curriculum** transfer credit from Texas community colleges is guaranteed to apply toward UT core requirements, but degree plans may specify how some core requirements should be fulfilled. Recommendations in this Guide satisfy core requirements with courses normally required by a student's major field of study at UT.
- Courses in which **grades lower than C-** are earned do not transfer. Grades from transfer credit are excluded from a student's internal **UT Austin grade point average** computation.
- **College Algebra** (MATH 1314 or 1414) counts in Applied Learning & Development majors only, when transferred in combination with MATH 1350.
- Up to three semester hours in **physical education activity** coursework may be applied as elective credit toward any degree in the College of Education.
- Up to nine semester hours in **Air Force, Military, or Naval Science** may be applied as free elective credit toward any degree in the College of Education.

# Courses Recommended for Transfer

*expressed in Texas Common Course Numbering designations*

## Writing & Literature

ENGL 1301 (or 1306 for nonnative English speakers); one Substantial Writing Component/Writing Flag course chosen from ENGL 1302, 2311, or 2314; and one literature survey course chosen from ENGL 2321, 2322, 2323, 2326, 2327, 2328, 2331, 2332, or 2333.

## Foreign Language

*For Applied Learning & Development, EC-6 Bilingual major:* four semesters in Spanish, chosen from courses numbered SPAN 1311, 1411, or 1511 (1st semester); 1312, 1412, or 1512 (2nd semester); and 2311 & 2312 (3rd & 4th semesters).  
*For all other degrees and majors:* two semesters in a single language, chosen from courses numbered 1311, 1411, or 1511 (1st semester) and 1312, 1412, or 1512 (2nd semester). SGNL 1301, 1401, or 1501 and SGNL 1302, 1402, or 1502 can also be counted.  
*(Students pursuing Texas teacher certification are strongly encouraged to satisfy the foreign language requirement with Spanish coursework.)*

## U.S. & Texas Government

Two courses chosen from one of the following combinations:  
GOVT 2301+2302, 2305+2306, 2301+2305, or 2301+2306.  
*(Because community colleges organize the two-course legislative requirement sequence differently, it is strongly recommended that students take both courses at one institution.)*

## U.S. History

Two courses chosen from HIST 1301, 1302, 2301, 2327, 2328, and 2381.

## Social Science

*For Applied Learning & Development:* PSYC 2301.  
*For Athletic Training:* PSYC 2301 and one course chosen from ANTH 2351; ECON 2301 or 2302; GEOG 1303; or SOCI 1301, 1306, or 2339.  
*For Kinesiology & Health, Sport Management major:* ECON 2301 or 2302, and either PSYC 2301 or SOCI 1301.  
*For Kinesiology & Health, other majors:* PSYC 2301 and one course chosen from ANTH 2351; ECON 2301 or 2302; GEOG 1303; or SOCI 1301, 1306, or 2339.

## Mathematics

*(Credit values vary among community colleges; the second digit of some course numbers listed here may instead be 3, 4, or 5.)*

*For Applied Learning & Development:* MATH 1350+1351; and a third course chosen from MATH 1324, 1332, 1342, 2312, 2342, 2413, or 2417.  
*For Athletic Training:* MATH 2312, 2413, or 2417.  
*For Kinesiology & Health, Applied Movement Science major:* MATH 2312, 2413, or 2417.  
*For Kinesiology & Health, Exercise Science major:* one calculus course chosen from MATH 2413 or 2417.  
*For Kinesiology & Health, other majors:* one course chosen from MATH 1324, 1425, 1332, 1342, 2312, 2342, 2413, or 2417.

## Natural Science

*(Community colleges may number lecture & lab credit separately, for example CHEM 1411 may be offered as 1311 & 1111.)*

*For Applied Learning & Development:*

- Part I – a two-course sequence in one discipline, chosen from ASTR/PHYS 1403+1404; BIOL 1406+1407, 1408+1409, or 2401+2402; CHEM 1411+1412; GEOL 1401+1402 or 1403+1404; or PHYS 1401+1402, 1405+1407, or 2426+2426.
- Part II – a third course in a second discipline, chosen from those above and from ANTH 2301, 2302, or 2401; CHEM 1405, 1406, 1407, or 1408; COSC 2336 or 2436; GEOG 1301; or GEOL 1445 or 1447. MATH (excluding 1314, 1414, and credit used for the core mathematics requirement) is also applicable, but after credit in any calculus course is earned only courses for which calculus is a prerequisite can be counted.

*(Recommendations above substitute for a three-course integrated science sequence offered at UT Austin for EC-6 certification candidates, but additional coursework may be necessary to prepare for certification exams. To avoid taking more courses than needed for degree purposes, students may wish to defer enrollment in natural science coursework until transferring to UT.)*

*For Athletic Training:*  
BIOL 1406 (preferred for pre-physical therapy/pre-medical students) or 1408; and CHEM 1411+1412.

*For Kinesiology & Health:*  
BIOL 1406 (preferred for pre-physical therapy/pre-medical students) or 1408; and CHEM 1411+1412. Additionally, for the Exercise Science major: PHYS 1401+1402.

## Visual & Performing Arts

One course chosen from ARCH 1301, 1302, or 1311; ARTS 1301\*, 1303, or 1304; DRAM 1310\*, 2336, 2361, or 2362; HUMA 1315; or MUSI 1306\* or 1310. (\*Recommended for students pursuing teacher certification.)

## Other Coursework

*For Applied Learning & Development:* KINE/PHED 1331.  
*For Athletic Training:* KINE/PHED 2356 and SPCH 1321.  
*For Kinesiology & Health, Sport Management major:* BCIS 1305 or 1405.
